his easy walk takes you through the beech woods and fields above the hotel, following a quiet path to the tranquil hamlet of Hyde, with its elegant old houses and gardens - the perfect quick stroll for the morning, midday or the evening!

1. Turn right out of the hotel driveway and walk up the hill to the white gates and cattle grid.



- 2. Note the elegant Cotswold stone Georgian house to your right.
- 3. Turn left onto Love Lane, Continue along

right.
